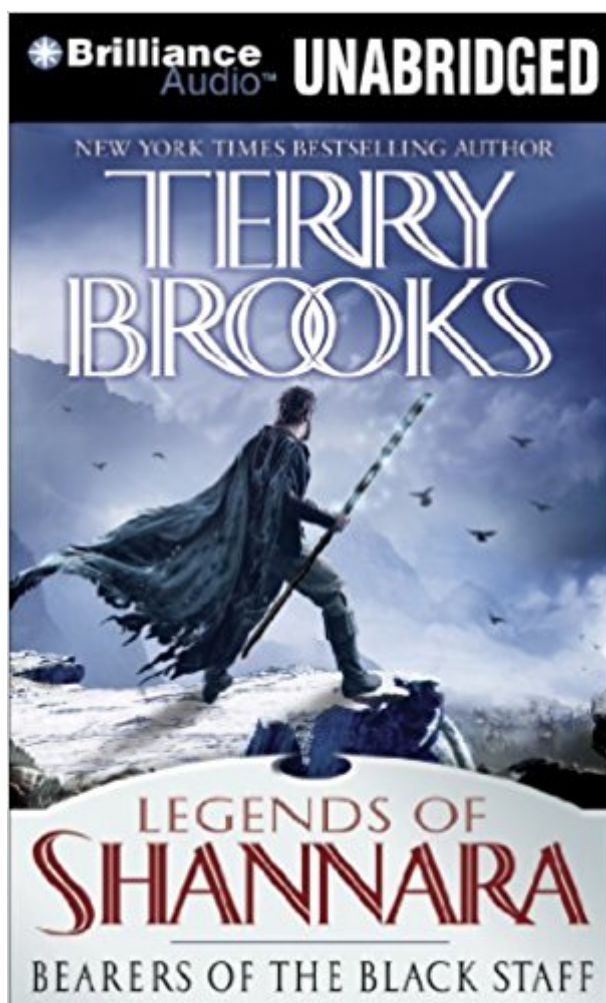


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Bearers Of The Black Staff (Legends Of Shannara Duology)

This first volume of Legends of Shannara opens five centuries after the worldwide holocaust that ended the Genesis of Shannara trilogy. Elves, humans, and other races are slowly restoring a modest civilization in a mountain valley protected by their combined magic. Now this sanctuary is threatened by the assault of monstrous creatures that seem to be either magic wielders or creations of magic greater than the valley's and of mysterious origin. Another stalwart band of heroes, the title characters, is drawn from all the races to fight although this time they are not marching out on a quest but fighting in the last ditch. The forthcoming sequel, *The Measure of the Magic*, will, as it were, measure their degree of success for the time being. The author's success needs no measuring anymore it is enormous, thanks to a growing gift for characterization, pacing, and world building, not to mention magic that may not be supremely original in conception but manages to be increasingly enthralling to literally millions of readers over what is approaching two generations. --Roland Green --This text refers to an out of print or unavailable edition of this title.

This is a necessary book in the series, tying together the (6) prequel novels with the rest of the Shannara series. It ties a lot of stuff together and I noticed a lot of things I thought were important. I noticed that when the world was destroyed because of the machinations of man and the remnants escaped to be protected until it was safer, they still didn't learn. You can see several places where greed and selfishness are causing the same types of problems as before and how no one seems to have learned from their mistakes. You get to see what has become of the Knights of the Word, as well. Also, while it's never clearly stated that I can see, it seems to me like a lot of their power is a precursor to druidic magic. I noticed that in the prequels, though it had more impact in these books that had a setting more closely resembling the Shannara world. The Knights of the Word shoot blue fire out of their staves and devote their lives to helping people. That sounds to me an awful lot like the basic tenant and the more powerful abilities of the druids, though some practice it more than others. The KotW are pretty badd***, but I can totally see Allanon as a KotW who is so awesome he doesn't need a staff. You also learn about the origins of the trolls and other creatures throughout the four lands. It's definitely worth the read and I recommend fans of the series jump on it. Assuming

First off, I am a huge Terry Brooks fan and an avid reader of many genre both Fiction and Non-Fiction. This book, one of three in the series, is the glue that binds the Old World to the World of Shannara. Brooks has captured the essence of the struggle for survival in a magical and post-apocalyptic world. The book flows as well as his first book, "The Sword of Shannara" and continues to surprise me just as he has done since 1977. I highly recommend this book and the series. With his last series Genesis of Shannara I felt he was back on track in his skill of incredible character development and ingenuity in plot. This two book series, unfortunately is falling flat. On his recent video readings that you can see from his official website [...] Mr. Brooks mentions his traditional character woes and when things can't get worse they actually do and he prides himself on that. Again, unfortunately, all the character woes are getting predictable for the seasoned Brooks reader. Even the twists in this first book of the series, I kept thinking "really, are we going to go there, again?" The twists, some not so predictable, were rushed. Except I loved the Troll son/spy twist - that was one not used before by Brooks. Maybe the clumsy developments were intentional with the falling of the protective barrier, the men and elves became complacent and could not think strategically. Although I have complained in the past about Brooks' series all being trilogies I wish this one could have been a three book series. There's still time, scrap the current conclusion and extend it to three books! I have no idea how he will successfully address the Elf mutany, the "men of the Hawk" religious conflict, as well as the outside world coming inside story lines. All this said, I am

wondering if it is time for the incredible, creative mind of Terry Brooks to close the World of Shannara off and focus on something new. I loved it when he jumped over to the Word/Void plot. It was new, and the magic was different. Better yet, get some of these trilogies on TV or in the Movies. The entire Shannara history could be a great sequence of mini-series on the SciFi channel but be sure to tie in the Word/Void. I think after I read the sequel to this book I would prefer to revisit his classic Shannara writings. It is Mr. Brooks' own fault, his skills are so superior that he has set the bar very high when it comes to Shannara worthy story lines. What's next, we jump back to the Druids? Brooks is still my favorite writer EVER and I have confidence he will regroup after this mess passes over.
