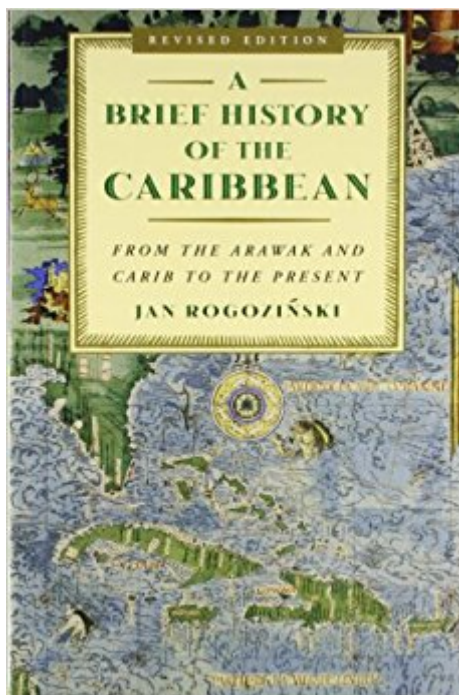

A freelance writer specializing in historical and technical subjects, Jan Rogozinski holds a Ph.D. in social and cultural history from Princeton University.

This is a well-written and fast-paced history of the Caribbean. It does its job admirably well. It begins with a topographical overview of the islands - what type of islands they are, what their climate and soil is like. It then takes the reader on a trip through time, beginning with the Native American peoples, through Columbus's discovery of the islands (yes, I wrote "discovery" - the concept of which is dealt with in a sidebar), to colonization. Now, any history of the Caribbean is

going to deal primarily with three things: sugar, slavery, and piracy. Of these three, piracy is the most fun to read about. Of course, there is the perfunctory disdain of the role of the tourist in the Caribbean, which may or may not be true (it all depends on the tourist). The book is supplemented with useful charts, maps, and pictures from the islands. If there is any fault with the book, it's just that it is an overview book. It is prone to the dangers of the genre - it deals with its subjects in broad strokes in order to tell THE ENTIRE STORY. Rogozinski is honest in pointing this out. Many of the really fun history books focus on a particular incident in history and focus on it in great detail. Personally, I was less interested in the coverage of recent politics on the islands. (Although the sections on Haiti and Cuba were fascinating.) I love the Caribbean and I love learning about it. This is a fine place to start.
